The annual Camp Ross picnic will be held on July 15th from 10am-2pm at **940 N. Moose Road, Mount Morris, IL**.



The burger special is the one and only "Haystack," a 1/3rd lb hand-packed burger, topped with onion straws and BBQ sauce.




INTERNATIONAL MOOSE CONVENTION 2023

FROM THE INTERNATIONAL MOOSE CONVENTION: "TWELVE THOUSAND LIVES MADE BETTER"

"Let the little children come to me. Do not keep them away. For they are like the kingdom of Heaven. God Bless Mooseheart. Amen."

Unknown to the Mooseheart children, at the same time they kneel at their beds to say their evening prayers, the members of the Moose, when gathered togather in friendship at the lodge, collectively face towards Mooseheart, fold their arms, bow their heads, and join the children in silent prayer. Then, following nine chimes of a bell, the words above are spoken aloud in prayer to close out the solemn Nine O'Clock Ceremony.

Special would be an acceptable adjective to describe an organization whose members collectively pray for the wellbeing of children. But the Loyal Order of the Moose has done so much more—putting thoughts and prayers into action. Their tireless work, fundraising, devotion, love and support made possible the founding and continuation of Mooseheart Child City & School, which has been home to nearly 12,000 children. Even more remarkable is that the gift of Mooseheart was bestowed on humanity not for the publicity, praise or fame; but rather, was motivated only by the desire to help children in need.

These 12,000 children arrived at Mooseheart's gates due to tragedy or difficulty. For some, Mooseheart became the only home they ever knew. Mooseheart not only became their home, but provided them with education, trained them in vocation, provided extracurricular activities, attended to religious upbringings, and prepared them to enter society as well-rounded citizens. At whatever age they arrived, by senior year it occurs to the children just how fortunate they are to have spent their years here, instead of where or how they might have spent them had they not come here.

But... It isn't until commencement day that the students are hit full force. Whether the senior class is as small as 5 or large as 150, there's no closer-knit group of young adults in this world. As they walk into the packed Fieldhouse, with sometimes as many as 4,000 in attendance, a fury of emotions rush through their bodies. Their younger Mooseheart brothers and sisters are there of course, as are their teachers and coaches. Most of the graduates have some natural family in attendance as well.

But, the rest of the crowd is made up of men and women, many in fraternal blazers, who have come from all over North America. They are the men and women of the Moose Fraternity; an order that truly cares for children in need. They have come in pilgrimage to Mooseheart to see the end product of their efforts. They are the ones who have made this beautiful place possible—and who have sacrificed to bring hope and a bright future.


